Sustainability Hunt Part #2

What is Sustainability? Sustainability is supporting healthy people, communities, and environments now and in the future. A great way to live a more sustainable life is by following the **Good Life Goals** and learning about how others are improving their lives and communities through the goals.

Use these **Good Life Goal** descriptions to help you find photos to match each goal!



10) Be Fair

To create, play, and learn, one must first feel safe. Find public support of the Black Lives Matter movement. This could be a sign or mural.



11) Love Where You Live

Find a unique thing in your neighborhood that you enjoy. It can be a public space, a piece of art, a natural area, or anything else as long as it is special to you.



12) Live Better

Find a place where people can share and reuse things with other people in their community. This could be a public library, a used clothing store, or a donation center.



13) Act On Climate

Find a recycling bin and a compost bin sitting next to each other. If you can't find a compost bin, make one for your family!



14) Clean Our Seas

Find an animal who relies on having a clean body of water for a healthy life. It might be a fish, turtle, or sea gull.



15) Love Nature

Find an animal's habitat. It might be a bird nest, a hole in the ground, or even an ant hill.



16) Make Peace

Find some peace or justice-inspired art. It may be a sculpture or a painting.



17) Do Good Work

Find a place in your community where people can come together to meet.

When you're done, make a digital or print collage and reflect on all of your photos. Were you inspired to think about the future of your community by what you found? Did you discover something new that you believe is important for your community to thrive?
